UNITED STATES SUPPORT FOR ALBANIA'S 2013 PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS

Monitoring Pre-Election Period

To assess how Albanian is preparing for the June elections, the Embassy's Political and Economic Section is sending officers to cities throughout Albania. During these trips, the officers meet with local government officials, political party representatives, and other groups to view election preparations first hand. They also meet with national leaders from all the main political parties and many smaller ones to share opinions on the upcoming elections.

Pre-Election Debates



The U.S. Embassy is hosting a series of preelection debates that will be televised

on Albanian networks prior to the elections in June 2013. The goal is to introduce issue-based policy

debate into the electoral process, to encourage political parties to focus on issues in their campaigns, and to engage citizens in policy discussions on issues relevant to Albania's future. The debate participants are Party Youth League members from five Albanian political parties. Debate participants have received policy and rhetoric training, and the debates will be moderated by skilled practitioners. This will be the first international-style debate televised in Albania.

Central Elections Commission

The U.S. is providing technical assistance to the Albanian Central Elections Commission in two major areas: 1)Election planning and preparation, including an electoral integrity assessment, assistance with operational and departmental plans, work on a civic engagement strategy, and IT preparation and training; and 2) Post-election planning and evaluation, including work to evaluate the effectiveness of pilot technologies and an assessment of the execution of electoral duties at all relevant levels. The two major goals of this program are to provide world-class technical assistance to the CEC to have a positive impact on June 2013 elections, and to use lessons-learned to work towards stronger electoral institutions in the future.

Domestic Elections Monitoring

USAID is sponsoring a NGO-based monitoring effort, the Coalition of Domestic Observers, which will monitor all the

electoral process, including the pre-election, voting, and counting periods. The Coalition will recruit, train, and deploy highly visible, independent domestic observers in all regions of Albania. The Coalition will also provide regular updates to the public and the media on elections preparations, and near real-time updates during elections day and during the ballot voting process.
