

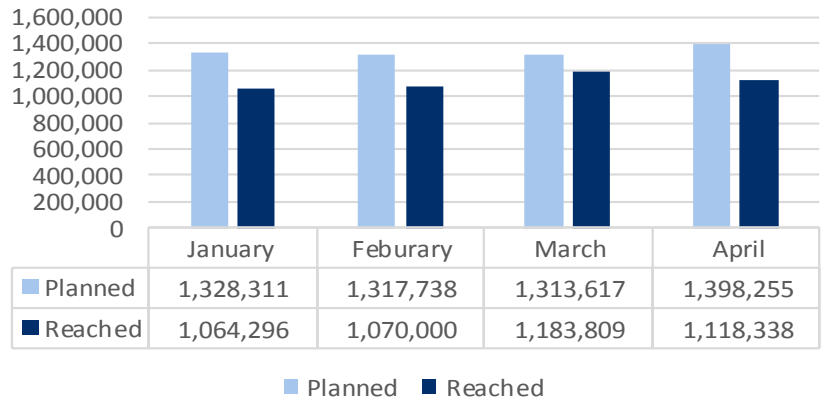
Food Security Response — April Outcomes

- ⇒ In April, USAID Office of Food for Peace (FFP) partner the UN World Food Program (WFP) reached over **1.1 million beneficiaries** and FFP NGO partners reached over **381,000 beneficiaries** in Borno and Yobe states with cash-based and locally procured emergency food assistance.
- ⇒ FFP NGO partners dispersed over **\$1.7 million into local markets** through cash-based food assistance, supporting market function, recovery, and stability.
- ⇒ FFP NGO partners screened over **8,700 children under five years of age** for acute malnutrition and there are now **571 Mother-to-Mother support groups** active in Borno and Yobe states.
- ⇒ Security incidents in Borno and Yobe negatively impacted market function and trade routes in some areas, resulting in delays or reduction in planned program activities.

Key Response Stats

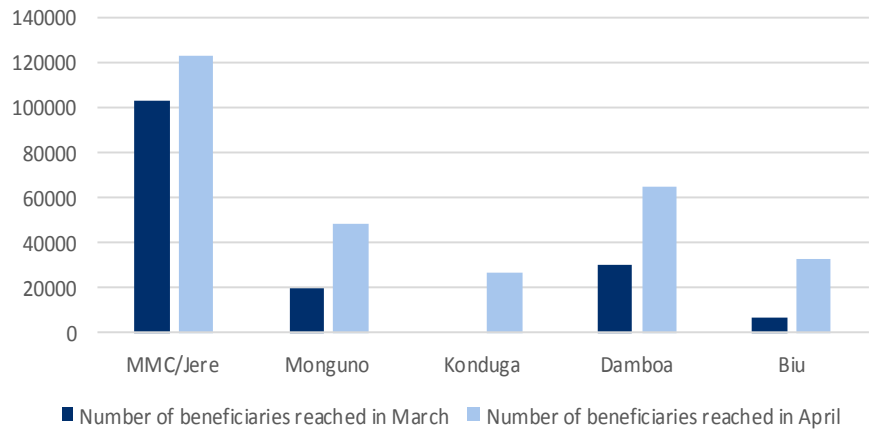
- ⇒ Since FY 2016, the US Government (USG) has provided over **\$498 million** in humanitarian assistance for the Lake Chad Basin region, including over **\$168 million in emergency food assistance in northeastern Nigeria**.
- ⇒ The USG is providing critical food and nutrition assistance, shelter, Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) activities, and health services to address urgent humanitarian needs in the region.
- ⇒ An estimated **5.2 million people** are projected to be in crisis or worse levels of acute food insecurity in mid-2017.
- ⇒ There are **1.7 million IDPs** in Adamawa, Borno, and Yobe states.

WFP Beneficiary Caseload



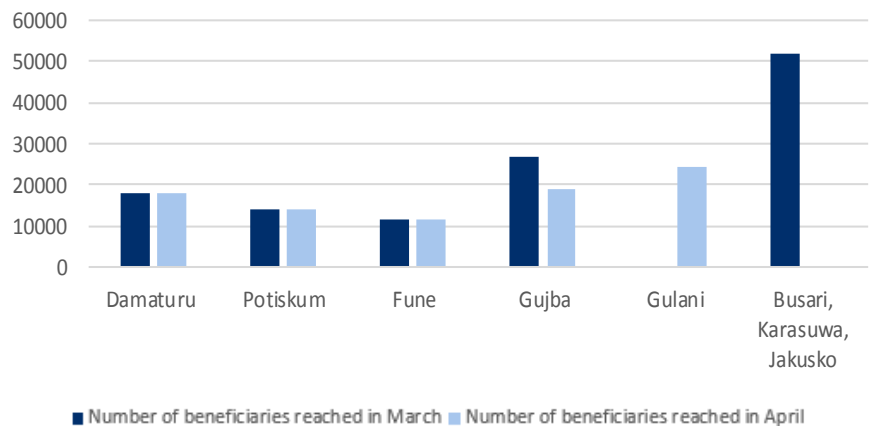
Note: WFP continues to face challenges in scaling up their operation to meet program targets due to continued insecurity in the region, which restricts or limits humanitarian access.
