

Feeding Central African Republic Refugees

Armed conflict and political instability in the Central African Republic (CAR) have **internally displaced over 503,000 people** and caused more than **481,000 refugees** to flee to neighboring countries as of May 2017. USAID's Office of Food for Peace (FFP) funds emergency food assistance to Central African refugees through the UN World Food Program (WFP) in Cameroon, the Democratic Republic of Congo, and the Republic of Congo. FFP supports WFP to **respond to food insecurity and malnutrition** among Central African refugees through general food distributions, cash transfers, and food vouchers. In Fiscal Year 2017, FFP has provided approximately \$17 million for these interventions.
