Revised Standard Provision for Non-Governmental Organizations

PURPOSE: The purpose of this AAPD is to provide a revised Mandatory Standard Provision for U.S., Nongovernmental Recipients, "Applicability of 22 CFR Part 226 (May 2005).

BACKGROUND: Under the Mandatory Standard Provisions for U.S., Nongovernmental Recipients contained in ADS 303, the first provision addresses the applicability of 22 CFR 226 USAID's grants and cooperative agreements to U.S. Nongovernmental organizations. The provision is being revised to include all Standard Provisions for Non-US Nongovernmental Grantees, including the provision for Accounting, Audit and Records. This provision was previously excluded from Non-U.S., Nongovernmental subgrants. The revised provision is consistent with USAID awards to Non-U.S., Nongovernmental grantees and recipients.

GUIDANCE: For assistance awards (grants and cooperative agreements), when issuing a Request for Applications (RFA), the agreement officer must include the provision (Attachment 1) in the RFA and ensure its inclusion as a Mandatory Standard Provisions in the schedule of the award itself.

ATTACHMENT 1

1. APPLICABILITY OF 22 CFR PART 226 (May 2005)

(a) All provisions of 22 CFR Part 226 and all Standard Provisions attached to this agreement are applicable to the recipient and to subrecipients which meet the definition of "Recipient" in Part 226, unless a section specifically excludes a subrecipient from coverage. The recipient shall assure that subrecipients have copies of all the attached standard provisions.

(b) For any subawards made with Non-US subrecipients the Recipient shall include the applicable "Standard Provisions for Non-US Nongovernmental Grantees." Recipients are required to ensure compliance with subrecipient monitoring procedures in accordance with OMB Circular A-133.
